In the begining , the Dept. offered the General course only but it was upgraded with Honours course in the year 2002. So far eminent teachers like Prof. Prithwish Dutta, Prof. Shaktipada Pal, Prof. Rajkumar Ganguli, Prof. Subrata Chowdhury and Prof. Bhagbat Chandra Nandi served

the department as Full Time Teachers. Besides, assistance Sri Kalyanashis Bhattacharya, Sri Anindya Sundar Poria, Smt. Monika Satpoti, Smt. Papia Poria guest teachers of the department, in running the department worth mentioning. At present with four faculty members. Dr. Rajasree Debnath, Associate Professor, Sri Barun Rout and Dr.Saptarshi Pal. both Goyt. approved Part-Time Teachers and Sri Prasenjit Senapoti. Guest Teacher and more than 200 students, Dept. of Political Science is one of the leading departments of the colege.






